



Nippers and Youth Development

Under the leadership of Donna Hargreaves and the Junior Activities Committee our Nippers of North Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club enjoyed another solid season of Nippers that included competition at Nippers and surf carnivals and a structured training and education program.

It is always a pleasure to see our youngest members enjoying the beach on Sunday morning and learning about surf conditions and water awareness, making new friends and enjoying the beach as part of a structured learning program. This year we had two Under 14 members nominated for the final of the Sydney Airport Branch Age Championships Junior Life Saver of the Year (JLOTY) - Elizabeth Smith and Michael De Francesco and Michael was selected as the winner of this prestigious award. The quality of these two fine members is testament that the Nipper program is working and producing wonderful members and future life savers and Patrol Captains for North Cronulla Surf Life Saving club.

Nippers cannot happen each weekend without the Squad Leaders, Water Safety, Officials and beach crew who set up the courses and I Thank You for your continued support and dedication to your duties throughout the season. It is very reassuring for our youngest members to see the same helpful faces while they meet and exceed the own personal challenges each weekend.

A very important part of our surf club is our Junior and Senior Officials who travel to surf carnivals as accredited officials to



perform their various tasks across all areas of competition. Our Officials are vital to a healthy surf life saving organisation and I encourage Nipper parents next year to gain your Level 1 Official accreditation and become further engaged with the movement. This will be critical for future seasons because of the introduction of an official to competitor ratio at surf carnivals and the club will need more officials to meet those criteria.

The North Cronulla SLSC Iron Person Classic held on Australia Day 2016 was a great success due to the good organisation and management, our sponsors, excellent water safety teams, great officials and of course the young members who competed at the event. The number of entries was a record and the surf conditions were challenging but the event was well managed by the Officials on the day and a full program of events was completed.

The Youth Engagement Program (YEP) managed by Monika Di Maio our Youth Development Director was launched this season and will be developed and expanded over future seasons. This is designed to improve the engagement with our youth members and help guide them through the opportunities available as a member of the surf life saving association. It was fantastic to see a group of our Surf Rescue Certificate member's journey out to Wet & Wild to perform water safety for the Wet & Wild Nipper program and the feedback was these kids were one of the best groups of water safety teams they have seen.

Another exciting development for our Youth Development Team will be the launch of a new Youth and New Member Induction booklet and will be ready for the start of the new season. The booklet will be designed to help our youth and new members understand their obligations of them as a new surf life saver, outline objectives for youth development, list club contacts and provide other information on education, surf sports and lifesaving pathways.

Club Management Plan (CMP) 2012 - 2016

The current version of the CMP was extended for another season and is in the final year of operation. With the successful consideration and adoption of a new constitution in May 2016 there will be changes required to a new CMP to accommodate roles and positions changes in our Board of Directors.

We continue to develop and expand our capabilities across the 5 key functions of Surf Life Saving & Patrols, Training & Education, Surf Sports (Competition), Administration & Finance and Community and these are outlined in the report below.

One of the strategic goals of our CMP is to "provide opportunities to develop and support our club members and recognise their achievements" and we can proudly report that we have nominated, supported, endorsed and recognised many of our members so they can attend and experience the different Lifesaving, Training & Education and Competition programs that are available to our members over the last four seasons.

Surf Life Saving & Patrols

This season our Life Saving team and patrols were under the guidance and leadership of Gavan Duffy our Life Saving Director, Club Captain Jamie Primer and Club Vice Captain Kane Hughes.

We had 13 volunteer rostered patrols and continued on the theme of building Patrol Teams on our beach with the aim to improve team work and ability to meet the day to day challenges of providing volunteer life-saving patrols and beach management at North Cronulla SLSC.

The members of North Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club recorded the following activities during patrol season:

- Performed over 13,900 Volunteer patrols hours across 13 rostered patrols and all SLSA lifesaving and operational areas;
- Recorded 170 Rescues;
- Involved in over 1928 Preventative Actions;
- 62 First Aid cases.

The number of recorded rescues was much higher than the three year rolling average of 105 rescues due to a large number of rescues performed over the Australia Day weekend and a very busy season overall. Preventative Actions were down on the 3 year average and this was due to improved patrol and beach management skills.

This season we had 12 of our members who performed more than 100 hours of volunteer patrol duties and three outstanding Club members – Allan Freeman, Jarrod Tranter and Joel Wiseman performed over 150 hours of volunteer service to the community. Allan achieved a record of 217 hours of volunteer duty of our beach; Jarrod contributed 158 patrol hours to the community and Joel over 180 hours across patrols, Surfcom and Support Operations duties.

These members highlight the dedication of our members to their core duty which is surf lifesaving and performing patrols and are fine ambassadors for our motto "Vigilance and Service"

Our Club has been a very important and integral part of the local community for over 90 years by delivering on our motto of vigilance and service by providing volunteer lifesaving patrols each season at North Cronulla beach.

Our core responsibility is Life Saving and Patrols and once again we supported the local community with over 13,900 hours of volunteer patrols duty during the season and help education, train and keep proficient over 850 members during the season

One of our strategic goals is "To encourage the involvement of the wider community in the club and increase community awareness of the essential volunteer work performed by our club members" and we have delivered on the goal over the last four years.

Other support and promotion within the community include the use of the James Peryman Memorial Pool and club facilities for the Sutherland Shire Council Lifeguard Surf Education and water awareness programs over many seasons with 1000's of children enjoying our club facilities and gaining extremely important water safety and awareness skills.

The financial statements show a profit of \$33,607 for the year (2015 \$78,827).

This excellent result reflects the continued hard work of all members of the club.

Cash generated from operating activities during this financial year of \$126,717 (2015 \$178,942) was

invested in capital equipment for lifesaving, clubhouse assets and competition to value of \$123,066, resulting in an increase in cash held of \$20,287.

Further I would like to note that the club also holds and invests funds in trust on behalf of both the Tom Payne Foundation and the Nana Weiland Trust. The balances held at the end of the financial year are \$99,490 and \$391,834 respectively.



COMMUNICATION REPORT

IT IS INTERESTING TO LOOK BACK OVER ANNUAL REPORTS FROM THE PAST. YOU CANNOT HELP BUT NOTICE HOW MUCH TIMES HAVE CHANGED, SOME FOR THE BETTER AND IN SO MANY OTHER WAYS YOU COULD QUESTION PROGRESS AND REFLECT ON AN ERA WHEN TIMES WERE SIMPLER.

It was only a matter of a few years ago that a report of this content wasn't even included in the Annual Report as most of the references made within the report didn't even exist and hadn't been invented.

North Cronulla and Surf Lifesaving at all levels now has available many platforms for communication, most are instant and as such the demand for instant information has seen the creation of a new position on the North Cronulla SLSC Board for 2016-2017 and beyond that of Marketing and Communications Director.

Surf Lifesaving at all levels now generally uses only electronic forms of communications, it is extremely rare to receive any forms of correspondence via "snail mail". At the National Level Club Office Bearers, Members and Administrators are expected to create an account to access most important documents and information. At the State Level and Branch Level these documents are generally posted onto websites, with email reminders usually sent. Whilst instant, quick and time effective it has placed the role of Club Officers out of the reach of generations who are unable to access or use this technology and also placed unnecessary unrealistic time demands on Office Bearers in particular as instant communication often demands an instant response.

In addition to email and website communications, all levels of Surf Life Saving also use and operate their own Social Media platforms. There is now a need to check emails and websites and also monitor the platforms for all levels of the organisation which given the expectation that the message is instant the position can be demanding for a volunteer who is also working fulltime.

Over the past season North Cronulla have attempted to again keep our members well informed via a variety of mediums. This can be a delicate balance at times as it is important not to overload volunteers and also remember that most if not all members now receive instant messages from so many different sources such as other sporting and recreational groups, dentist and doctor reminders and messages from schools, clubs and the list continues.

The main platforms for communication, promotion and recognition utilised over the past twelve months include but are not limited to:

- **Club website** – easily accessible, no pass words required the website contains information relevant to the entire club including everything from patrols rosters and teams, function and event information, nippers news, key dates, competition and education information and news. Like all websites the key to the success is keeping the information current and up to date. Data entry is extremely time consuming and as such recognition needs to be made to the Club President Craig McKinnery who has been responsible for this task.
- **Club newsletter** – generally produced every week to two weeks during the season and then as required in the "off season", the newsletter is sent to members via email using SurfGuard. The newsletter provides members with information pertaining to everything from patrols, volunteer bar and raffle rosters, coming events, important dates and general reminders. The key to the success of the newsletter is that members take a few moments to open and read the document, this can be the greater challenge! Our Nippers produce a similar newsletter during the season. Copies of the newsletters are also uploaded onto the website.
- **Facebook** – still recognised as the most widely used form of social media the club now operates numerous Facebook pages and groups to keep members and sections informed. Both the club as a whole and our nippers have pages linked to the club website, in addition most sections operate their own groups established by section leaders, patrols and social groups to help communicate. The benefit to members is that it is free and allows all members and their families to stay in touch regardless of where they live or where they are travelling. Over the past twelve months Facebook has allowed us to share many achievements in the areas of Lifesaving, Competition and Education, thank our members and sponsors and share great stories from other sources.

- **Instagram** – as with Facebook, Instagram provides another medium for promotion and recognition. As a photo based form of social media the age old saying of a “picture tells a thousand words” Instagram allows followers to obtain a more visual perspective. Instagram has provided many opportunities over the past twelve to share stories and moments from all key areas of the club together with providing recognition especially for our valued sponsors.
- **Twitter** – whilst Twitter is the least used form of social media engagement based on follower numbers Twitter provides perhaps the best form of sponsor recognition. As a shorter message based form of social media Twitter allows for a combination of short message comments and photos for company based sponsors the ability to thank and tag them in always appreciated.

Future Directions for Social Media Communication are endless.

With most large SLS events now live streamed then uploaded onto YouTube it is certainly realistic to expect that North Cronulla will have in the coming seasons their own YouTube Channel together with many other forms of communication – most of which have probably not even been invented. The importance of personal face to face communication and phone calls should never be forgotten, as volunteers often just want to be personally thanked.






SURF AWARENESS PROGRAM

SURF AWARENESS

North Cronulla Surf Club allows Sutherland Shire Council Life Guards to utilise the North Cronulla Pool and Training Room together with The Harry Brown Room and Steve Warren Nipper Room as required to train roughly around 3000 students a year from 70 schools from inside and outside the shire.

A variety of programs have been designed and delivered to suit the age and needs of the students.

Designed for upper primary school students this 4 hour course offers students a fun and interactive experience. Students identify potential dangers, recognise safe and unsafe swimming areas, and learn how to identify waves, rips and currents. Students also learn swimming and deep water flotation techniques and develop skills in correct board paddling.

Swim	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Back Pool at North Cronulla - 100m swim (Feet off bottom/ record times) - Teach students to tread water/ float on their backs/ dolphin dive (Explain each)
DVD	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Watch Council DVD - Discuss using video session guide and manuals - Watch RIP video (explain Rips) - DVD, Manuals, questions are all in white tub.
Board Paddling	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Use rock pool if conditions suit - Correct board paddling technique - Explain rolling of board - Board rescues
Beach activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Flags - Relay's - Beach sprints - obstacle course
Beach walk	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Show and explain flags/ rips/ beach signs/ bluebottles etc.
Surf activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Only if conditions suit. - Ask teachers if students are allowed - Catch waves - No more than four in the water at a time.
Swim in flags	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - If conditions suit. - Ask lifeguard on duty - Stay with school on the beach or in the water.
Theory Exam	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Only used when asked - Multiple choice questions



SURF SURVIVAL (Certificate)

Designed for high school students this eight hour course covers the content of the surf awareness course plus board rescue techniques and emergency response procedures including CPR.

- Students need a certificate to be eligible for school surfing.
- Ensure students are competent. (Swim Test 200m<5mins, board rescues in the surf, CPR, Theory Exam)

SURF SAFETY TALKS

Normally conducted during the winter months. Occasionally held during the summer period although participants normally visit the beach for educational talks. The talk can include the video (DVD) and discussion and is normally based on the needs of the student. The talk includes:

- Discussion based around beach set-up
- The red and Yellow Flags
- Rips
- Safety

SPECIAL NEEDS SURF EDUCATION

The Surf Survival course is being continually adapted and modified for students and schools with special needs and behavioural problems. The program now caters for 5 special needs schools including Endeavour Special needs unit, Minerva, Caroline Chisholm SSP, Laurence Hargrave, and Campbell House. Each school has varying levels of ability which often requires more than one lifeguard being present whilst the program is run. The students who attended are extremely responsive to the programs in place.

LIFESAVING DIRECTOR'S REPORT

ANOTHER VERY SUCCESSFUL YEAR ON THE NORTH CRONULLA BEACH WITH NO LIVES LOST!

Without a doubt the 2015 – 2016 season was one of the busiest seasons that I can recall over the last eight years. During the later half of the season, weather patterns created a dangerous bank of the beach in front of the tower which caused many inexperienced swimmers to get into difficulty. On patrols on Australia Day 2016 and April 2 2016 , we had more than 15 rescues in each patrol with Australia Day exceeding 20 rescues. On these days I would like to thank, Steve Cardy, Jarrod Tranter, Morgan Tranter, Davin Sokuluk, Elena Sokuluk, Lauren Chadwick, Maddy McKinnery, Cheri Feher, Bronte Howell and all the others who were on duty these days but not mentioned for stepping up to the rescues. Unfortunately during the season there were some pretty bad injuries outside of patrol hours and number of serious callouts after hours with one quadriplegia occurring.

The club would like to thank everyone for their efforts to patrol the beach, and as a result of our proactive attention to the prevention of injury and accident as one of the main reason for the continuing success of the patrols at North Cronulla.


This year I would like to make a special thankyou to Jason Gollan and Steve Cardy who are retiring from their roles as two of our most experienced Patrol Captains, and on behalf of North Cronulla Surf Club, we thank Jason and Steve for their outstanding service. I also understand that Jason will be retiring from his position as Training and Education Director, and many of our current members have been trained by Jason will be sorry to see him go.

This season we have seen our numbers grow from our junior cadet members who are enjoying their first seasons as patrolling members and enjoying making friends and spending their patrol hours on the beach having a good time with their friends as well as fulfilling their rostered obligations.

Looking forward to the 2016- 2017 season, we will continue to refine the success of the team based patrols, where a focus was put on members patrolling with their mates and selection of services from within the patrols with the aim of increasing our retention of patrolling members each year. We welcome ongoing feedback, and if you have any suggestions for any improvements you would like to see, please let us know. As an example, the patrols Facebook page is up and running well and providing a resource for subs and patrol information for members.

2016 – 2017 will see a new 3 year Life Saving Services Agreement put in place with SLSNSW and we will as always seek to improve patrolling conditions for our members, and understand that being a patroller at the beach can conflict with work, family and competition pressure for each person. We will continue to maintain 14 patrols or more to cut down the number of individual hours each person must spend on the beach.

However, we can only maintain 14 patrols if we have enough services that can be provided to sustain 14 individual patrols. Accordingly, we do need people to do additional courses to fill important roles in the club and patrol roster. The roles add value to our younger member's skill sets and also look good on employment resumes, and this year is no exception, we need people to fill roles as Vice Captains, IRB drivers, Advances Resuscitation and Spinal injury management for our upcoming 2016 – 2017 season.



PROJECT PHOENIX

NORTH CRONULLA SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB INC. GEAR COMPLEX REDEVELOPMENT (REDEVELOPMENT OF EXISTING CLUB GEAR COMPLEX, CLUB AND COUNCIL FACILITIES AND CAFÉ).



Project Phoenix is moving through the various stages associated with the local council development application process and we have made fair progress over the last season. The Club needs to balance our Project Phoenix activities and work effort to match the operational and financial cycle of the season and the support of our members.

The current proposal is the demolition of the existing gear complex and equipment store area, a new two storey building with SLSC gear complex, Council amenities and a first floor commercial space with function restaurant and bar spaces and new Nipper room, caretaker room and existing heritage SLSC building to have minor upgrades for BCA and accessible compliance.

The site is now zoned RE1 Public Recreation under the new Sutherland Shire Local Environmental Plan 2015 (SSLEP 2015) and the key controls for the site are the SSLEP 2015 Sutherland Shire Local Environmental Plan 2015 and Sutherland Shire Council Draft Development Control Plan 2015 (SSDDCP 2015).

The Club has met with Sutherland Shire Council on several occasions over the last 12 months and presented a Project Phoenix Update on the project to a full closed council meeting on 22nd February 2016. This was well received by Councilors at meeting and we outlined the changes made to concept plans to address concerns raised and outlined next steps to be taken in the next six months.

Outcomes of the meetings included the requirement for an updated Plan of Management (POM) for North Cronulla SLSC to be created and also to be included in a Plan of Management for Dunningham Park. Council has started preliminary work on a proposed major project for the construction of a new North Cronulla Sea Wall and we have approval to continue with Project Phoenix DA process in parallel with any North Cronulla Sea Wall activities.

One important meeting was with the Architectural Review Advisory Panel (ARAP) held on 31st March 2016. The Panel consists of three external professional architects and an external landscape architect and was established to assist in improving design quality of development in Sutherland Shire.

A full package of plans, reports, documents and statements were prepared by our architects, town planners, arborists and heritage consultants in preparation for the APAP meeting. The recommendations from the ARAP panel are currently under review with our project team and council and a final design for

the project will be created and used as the final design for the DA process.

The Club has received the first payment of \$30,000 from our Community Development Grant for the North Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club – Upgrade of facilities project (Project Phoenix) and this will be used to offset the Project Phoenix expenditure. The expenditure for last season on Project Phoenix was \$43,600 and this is reported in our 2015 to 2016 financial statements contained in the annual report.

A variation report was submitted to the department to cover changes in reporting milestones and dates to reflect changes and delays experienced to date. This was accepted by the department and now has an updated and realistic reporting timetable in place to accommodate delays in the process and extra work required for development application.

This project is critical for the viable future of North Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club and will provide the operational and commercial platform to allow current and future members to deliver our core responsibilities of Lifesaving and Patrols and protecting the community.





- 3rd in the Male Teams,
- 2nd U23 Mass Rescue,
- 4th U23 Rescue

This seasons Australian Titles was held at Mooloolaba as a warm event for the 2016 Summer Aussies in near dead conditions. There we achieved some firsts for the club. Once again we had several members selected to race for both the NSW and WA Interstate teams. Mitch Cardy and Corey Lewis represented NSW and Kate Janssen, Lillian Hassett, Felicity Hassett, Lucy Green, Addisson Lewis, Ryan Forsyth and myself all getting the opportunity to be drafted to race with WA. This year we made 4 out of the eight Australian finals, with many of the other events our crews were knocked out in the Semi-finals.



SURFBOAT SECTION REPORT

THE 2015/2016 SURF LIFESAVING SEASON HAS BEEN LONG, BUSY AND PRODUCTIVE FOR THE NORTH CRONULLA BOAT SECTION.

Each season we have set goals that develop and challenge our rowers and the section as a whole. This season we committed ourselves to changing our blackboard to electronic, Bass Marathon, South Coast series, ASRL, Ocean Thunder, NSW and Australian championships, (with the boat relay being a major goal) and each time team work and dedication have rewarded us with success. We have represented our club with pride and earned a reputation amongst our fellow competitors and clubs as a boat section to be respected.

Fourteen Open Crews and three Masters Crews started the season with enthusiasm and determination. This season saw the first time our club has had five Women Boat Crews on the water. All our crews have been competitive and results across all carnivals were fantastic.

The River Run in October marks the beginning of our season. We use it to set goals and to build on our fitness base. Seven crews stepped up to the challenge. Donny Workman took the opportunity to oversee style and with video footage we gave crews feedback on what they needed to develop or maintain.

Our youngest crew, the "Queen Bees" tested the water at **The Garie Dash** and this gave them the motivation to look for a future in boat rowing for North Cronulla. We will see them and our new young guns on the bay throughout winter and competing next season.

Over the New Year, whilst many of us were on a break, a few legends set out to participate in the **George Bass Surf Boat Marathon** from Batemans Bay to Eden. The boys came home with second in the Masters division, a fitting reward for their winter training, hard work and dedication. A classic example of the excellent role models we have at our club. Steve Swane explains more detail in his sweeps report below.

Throughout the season, thirteen North Cronulla Boat Crews, entered the highly competitive **South Coast Series** and spent 4 weekends thrashing it out against the best in the business in tough surf conditions. North Cronulla won the overall series.

More success came our way with Mark 'Bluey' Lea's Open Women's Crew, proudly sponsored by Back to Balance Chiropractic and Physiotherapy, winning the **Ocean Thunder series**. Bluey's Open Men's Crew, sponsored by Maher Partners, also competed in the series against the best 'A' crews in Australia.

We dominated the boat racing at the **Interclub** carnival and retained the Boat Trophy for another year!!

In late February, seventeen North Cronulla crews entered into the highly contested **Australian Surf Rowers League (ASRL)** held at Shell Harbour. Crews from around Australia participated in the event over four days and the competition was fierce. In the Master's Division, Steve 'Yappy' Swane's (200 years) Crew

We were fortunate enough to win the Branch and State Carnivals and convincingly placed our club in the Australian Boat Relay final. 



SYDNEY BRANCH DELEGATE'S REPORT

DIRECTOR DONNA HARGRAVES, SECRETARY REBECCA SHARPE, DEPUTY DIRECTOR BROOK FLEMING AND THEIR COMMITTEE SHOULD BE THANKED AND CONGRATULATED FOR THEIR EFFORT IN LEADING THE NORTH CRONULLA JUNIOR SECTION FOR A GREAT 2015/16 SEASON OF NIPPERS.



North Cronulla Juniors not only put their best teams forward for competition, but importantly ensured Sunday nippers was a safe and enjoyable place for our members to spend a Sunday morning, and retained the focus on education and development of future lifesavers for the senior section. We saw our 14's complete their SRC at the start of the season and begin their community service with the club by patrolling our beach. We thank the 14's for spending their time in Nippers, hope they have lots of great memories and enjoy their time in the Surf Lifesaving movement for many years to come.

Doug Hawkins was once again the Sydney Branch Junior Development Director and brought to the role his continued passion for developing lifesavers of the future. Doug was fantastically supported by our own Donna Hargraves whose energy and commitment to junior lifesaving is just amazing when you also consider Donna is our Nipper Director, Secretary to the Sydney Branch Junior Development Committee and an official who has helped out not only at local carnivals, but Branch, State and Aussies for both Juniors and Seniors.

The focus for the Sydney Branch in 2015/16 was as follows:

- Engaging with local clubs in delivering their strategy
- Saving lives 24/7
- Ensuring Sydney Branch clubs remain healthy
- Government recognition across various levels of government
- Financial security
- Effective branch management
- Embedding a philosophy of Involving Australians, learning for life and active for life

- Being the leading branch in NSW and Australia, continuing to and innovate, leading from the front, challenging what need to change

Development camps were once again held this season for the 13's (4/6 December) and 11's (29/31 January) and were a great success with most clubs in the Sydney branch sending their required numbers. Whilst this camps are a significant costs subsidised by the branch they are highly regarded with great active participation from everyone who attends.

In summary, some of the key achievements for this year include:

- 6,800 nippers this year across the branch, making Sydney branch the largest in Australia. These numbers are slightly down by around 10% overall, however comes off a period of strong growth.
- 315 experience under 14's graduated in surf lifesaving.
- Age managers continue to grow with the Age manager's course becoming more popular and an important part to ensure Age Managers are qualified having a common level of competency to be responsible for our children on the beach each Sunday.
- Stability in the committee's clubs have been good with not a great deal of change
- 1,412 kids competed at the branch championships and they all got in the water – the first for a number of years. Participation in Junior LifeSaver of the Year was also strong with some great candidates.
- SRC getting good results from training. Ongoing training through the years is great delivering great lifesavers.
- All clubs in the branch successfully completed their emergency drills and took key learnings for future improvement

On the competition front:

- The Interbranch was held at Cape Hawke on the 12/13 December 2015. Once again it was a great weekend with the Sydney team finishing a very close second to Sydney Northern Beaches. North Cronulla was very well represented with some outstanding results from our competitors.
- Sydney Branch Nippers were able to test their skills in a range of carnivals over the year, often in very testing conditions. 10 local carnivals we held, plus the NSW Age and Australian Youth Championships
- A highly successful Branch Championships – the largest in the country – was held at Maroubra Beach in near perfect weather conditions. For the first time in a number of years

the full program was completed despite their being quite testing surf conditions, and importantly the 8s, 9s and 10s were able to get in the water. There is opportunity to reassess the running of events for these age groups next year.

- NSW Age Championships was a great success this year, under the stewardship of Wayne Druery, with over 5,000 competitors. A highlight for Sydney Branch was the first ever nipper from Burning Palms who came 6th in the U9 beach sprints, following her gold at Sydney Branch.

Financially the Junior Branch remains in a very stable position with the renewal of the sponsorship with Sydney airport for a future 3 years. The very happy with the arrangement and would like to do more. The branch remained on budget. Key expenses to the branch include: Development camps \$48k (a quarter of which is funded from the clubs) Branch age champs \$14k, Distinct carnivals \$3k.

Into 2017 some of the key deliverable and activities will include:

- Despite large numbers of people attending officials courses (and the demand is greater than the ability to supply trainers) we still struggle as a branch to provide sufficient officials for local carnivals. From next season the ratio will be 1 official for every 10 competitors. This ratio must be met for clubs to compete going forward
- A Nippers emergency kit is nearing completion on the design phase. Each club will be supplies 1 kit. The box will contain: 4 sets of flippers, 5 dye makers, 14 goggles, water safety shirts, flares, binoculars, bags, high viz short sleeve shirts, makers, 30 metres rope. These will need to be on the beach every Sunday
- The branch has potential funds for local clubs to invest in their future capability and is open to ideas/suggestion for funding
- Deeping in the relationship with Sydney airport to include potentially nippers forming part of a video campaign at the airport for a "Welcome to Australia" messaging and safe swimming posters. Junior lifesavers will also get a VIP tour of the airport with the CEO and a session on leadership post the tour
- Consideration of developing a localised version of the Sydney Water Series to encourage local competitors as well as Illawarra and Sydney Northern Beaches to participate

Thanks for a great 2015/16 season, and we look forward to building on momentum as we go into next year.

In the 1963/64 season, Paul Edwards began his career in the Rescue and Resuscitation event. It was to be the commencement of a career that ceased on Thursday 3rd March 2016. A period of 53 years of incredible service to R&R and Surf Lifesaving. Paul was a Champion Competitor, an outstanding Coach (one of if not the best) sort after by many clubs nationwide, an Official with great knowledge and a visionary: continually working to improve this great event for Competitors, Coaches and Officials.

History will show in 1969 at Clifton Beach Tasmania, Paul was a member of the first team in our club's history to win the Open R&R Championship of Australia annexing the Association Premiership of Surf Life Saving.

Paul coached many R&R teams at our club with many successes at Branch & NSW Championships.

He coached two Junior R&R teams to Australian Championship victory in 1976 and 1986

Apart from his competition prowess, he achieved so much as an active member. Paul was an outstanding Lifesaver, he was selected to be a Patrol Captain at 17 years of age. Paul also committed many hours towards Administration, serving on the Management Committee holding the positions of Treasurer for

4 consecutive years, and Deputy President for 2.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2016

1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

New, revised or amending Accounting Standards and Interpretations adopted

The incorporated association has adopted all of the new, revised or amending Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period.

Any new, revised or amending Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted.

Basis of preparation

In the officers' opinion, the incorporated association is not a reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements.

These are special purpose financial statements that have been prepared for the purposes of complying with the New South Wales legislation the Associations Incorporation Act 2009, the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and associated regulations. The officers have determined that the accounting policies adopted are appropriate to meet the needs of the members of North Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated.

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements specified by the Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 'Presentation of Financial Statements', AASB 107 'Statement of Cash Flows', AASB 108 'Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors', AASB 1031 'Materiality', AASB 1054 'Australian Additional Disclosures' and AASB 1048 'Interpretation and Application of Standards', as appropriate for not-for-profit oriented entities. These financial statements do not conform with International Financial Reporting Standards as issued by the International Accounting Standards Board ('IASB').

Historical cost convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Critical accounting estimates

The preparation of the financial statements requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise its judgement in the process of applying the incorporated association's accounting policies. The areas involving a higher degree of judgement or complexity, or areas where assumptions and estimates are significant to the financial statements, are disclosed in note 2.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2016

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefit will flow to the incorporated association and the revenue can be reliably measured. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

Donations

Donations are recognised at the time the pledge is made.

Grants

Grants are recognised at their fair value where there is a reasonable assurance that the grant will be received and all attached conditions will be complied with.

Interest

Interest revenue is recognised as interest accrues using the effective interest method. This is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a financial asset and allocating the interest income over the relevant period using the effective interest rate, which is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash receipts through the expected life of the financial asset to the net carrying amount of the financial asset.

Other revenue

Other revenue is recognised when it is received or when the right to receive payment is established.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Income Tax

As the incorporated association is a charitable institution in terms of subsection 50-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as amended, it is exempt from paying income tax.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2016

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a first-in first-out basis.

Trade and Other Receivables

Accounts receivable are recognised initially at the transaction price (i.e. cost) and are subsequently measured at cost less provision for impairment. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

At the end of each reporting period, the carrying amount of accounts receivable and other receivables are reviewed to determine whether there is any objective evidence that the amounts are not recoverable. If so, an impairment loss is recognised immediately in the income and expenditure statement.

Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Plant and equipment is stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the items.

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated on a straight line basis to write off the net cost of each item of property, plant & equipment over the useful life as follows:

Class of Fixed Asset	Useful Life
Office Equipment	3-5 Years

The residual values, useful lives and depreciation methods are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each reporting date. An item of property, plant & equipment is derecognised upon disposal of when there is no future economic benefits to the association. Gains and losses between the carrying amount and the disposal proceeds are taken to profit or loss.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2016

Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

Non-financial assets are reviewed for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognised for the amount by which the asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount.

Recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's fair value less costs to sell and value-in-use. The value-in-use is the present value of the estimated future cash flows relating to the asset using a pre-tax discount rate specific to the asset or cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. Assets that do not have independent cash flows are grouped together to form a cash-generating unit.

Trade and Other Payables

These amounts represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the incorporated association prior to the end of the financial year and which are unpaid. Due to their short-term nature they are measured at amortised cost and are not discounted. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST.

The net amount of GST recoverable or payable to the Australian Taxation Office is included in other receivables or other payables in the Statement of Financial Position. Cash flows are presented on a gross basis.

2 Critical accounting judgements, estimates and assumptions

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts in the financial statements. Management continually evaluates its judgements and estimates in relation to assets, liabilities, contingent liabilities, revenue and expenses. Management bases its judgements, estimates and assumptions on historical experience and on other various factors, including expectations of future events, management believes to be reasonable under the circumstances. The resulting accounting judgements and estimates will seldom equal the related actual results. The judgements, estimates and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next financial year are discussed below.

The useful lives could change significantly as a result of technical innovations or some other event. The depreciation and amortisation charge will increase where the useful lives are less than previously estimated lives, or technically obsolete or non-strategic assets that have been abandoned or sold will be written off or written down.


