

In honour of both Brendan and Zane the club has introduced two important Awards to present to the membership.


FINANCE

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Where to start after such an interrupted season?

I would like to thank all members for their resilience and patience during such a turbulent year. Another big thank you to the Board of Management for their support, guidance, and efforts during the season. We encountered many highs and lows with everchanging rules due to COVID that we needed to adhere to, to be able to keep the club open.

We started the year on a high when we were finally able to re-open the fitness room and swimming pool to our members, even though with some restrictions.

The club came together to raise funds for "GOTCHA 4 LIFE" with a 24-hour row. A fabulous event, which at the time was important as it brought all sections and members together over a 24-hour period to make sure we had 3 or more Rowing Ergos and 2 Ski Ergos working continuously for 24 hours. Special mention to Michael Bofinger and his team on a sensational effort with great results, the set-up of the area was like a small city. Members as young as 6 and as old as 90 were involved, we also had some special guests attend and jumped on the machines, Mark Speakman (NSW Attorney General and Cronulla MP), Carmelo Pesce (SSC Mayor) and Steven Pearce (CEO SLSNSW).

Our AGM was held, under circumstances never seen before, with restrictions in the

numbers allowed to attend, the meeting was for the first ever time livestreamed over the internet via ZOOM, which allowed members to view the meeting from the comfort of their own home. Whilst the meeting had its challenges, it was well attended, and 3 new Life Members were inducted into the club's history books. Well deserve accolades for Barry Fretten, Geoff Streater and Michael Bofinger. Due to restrictions, there was no refreshments served and members celebrated offsite.

Patrols commenced with a bang, extremely hot weather and restrictions on travel increased the numbers of public attending the beach, the patrols worked well during these extreme days.

At the beginning of the season there was doubt if carnivals would be held during the season, decisions were being made weekly and changes to formats made often. Even with carnivals in doubt each section continued training with positivity, hoping for competition to commence. The first of the seasons carnivals was a Boat Carnival, a new carnival developed out of COVID, the "Bate Bay Gold", which replicated the Coolongatta Gold due to travel restrictions. The Club's annual Christmas Carnival was postponed and eventually cancelled due to the lack of sand on the beach and restrictions required to host the event made it too difficult to proceed.

work in keeping the public safe - NO LIVES LOST - an excellent result again. We need to maintain this statistic.

The Nipper Committee introduced some changes to their program to work within the COVID guidelines. There was an enormous amount of effort behind the scenes from the Nipper Executive lead by Colin Bulloch for them to be able to run a Nipper program. Changes included running the Under 6 and 7's on a Friday afternoon, split starting times on Sunday mornings for age groups. These changes allowed every Nipper the opportunity to participate, unfortunately the standard Sunday around the pool after Nippers was affected by the COVID restrictions. The section ran the Australia Day Iron person Carnival with great success, even under some restrictions.

FINANCE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

As Finance Director and on behalf of the Board of Directors I present the 2021 audited financial statements.

The financial statements show a profit from ordinary operations of \$588,388 less Project Phoenix development costs of \$354,365 providing a net profit of \$234,023 for the year (2020 \$73,245 loss).

This result was impacted due a significant bequest from Herbert McConnell.

Cash generated from operating activities during this financial year of \$272,880 (2020 \$157,686), was invested in capital equipment for lifesaving, clubhouse assets and competition to value of \$48,735, resulting in an increase in cash held of \$224,145 (2020 \$76,872 increase).

Thank you and well done to the board and the office staff of Glenn-Marie & Helen for all your hard work during the year.

EDUCATION DIRECTOR'S REPORT


The 2020-21 season for the Education and Training section was a very busy, but a very successful and rewarding season.





Colleen Passfield, a member of the Botany Bay Family History Society has been good enough to share with us her recollection of meeting Major James (Jim) Peryman (this is an excerpt).

A JAFFA MILKSHAKE

I was rather shy and timid and working in King's Milk Bar (near the Cronulla picture theatre) was a real challenge for me. Auntie Jean said I was white as a sheet the first time I served in the shop. I soon began to enjoy the experience as I gained more confidence, working on Saturday and Sunday afternoons and in the school holidays.

Late one Sunday afternoon a young man came in and ordered a Jaffa milkshake. Embarrassed, I had to admit I didn't know what a Jaffa milkshake was. He explained it was a scoop of chocolate syrup, a scoop of orange syrup and then the other normal milkshake ingredients. Chatting, he introduced himself as Jim and said he was a lifesaver at North Cronulla. Many of my friends were members of Cronulla Surf Club and there was strong competition between the clubs. I attended the surf carnivals whenever I could and followed the results in the newspapers so this was an opportunity to discuss my interest.

Intrigued by this unusual order of a Jaffa milkshake, I soon discovered that Jim was the son of Mario Peryman, the manager of the Cronulla branch of the Commonwealth Bank. Jim, (first name was Major but always known as Jim) was also Club Captain of North Cronulla Surf Life Saving club and was employed at Hurstville branch of the Commonwealth Bank. The following Saturdays and Sundays after that initial order, Jim would come in, late in the afternoon when patrols had ended, and order his Jaffa milkshake. I looked forward to seeing him and would often start preparing the shake before he ordered it, together with a generous scoop of icecream.

On Sunday afternoon, 19 February 1950, someone came running into the milk bar with the news of an accident at North Cronulla beach and that a person had drowned. We were shocked to learn later that Jim Peryman, aged 24, was dead. On patrol duty, he was beltman as his R&R team manned the reel and line and they went to the aid of a young girl carried out in treacherous surf. He had reached her and was about to bring her in when seaweed entangled the line and he was dragged under. The other lifesavers, Kevin Slade and Frank Bergstrom, who had been

supporting the girl, Daphne Knowles, stayed with her after Jim disappeared. The girl, aged 17, was brought back safely to the shore on a surf ski by Ike Smith, boat captain of the club.

Peryman was dragged under the water back to the beach after lifesavers had mistaken a signal. They thought that Jim had freed himself and that the weight was caused by seaweed. They were horrified to discover Jim's unconscious body entangled in the weed. Attempts by several doctors on the beach failed to revive him and he was taken by ambulance to St George Hospital where he was placed in an iron lung. Sadly, despite these efforts, he did not survive.

The need for a quick release belt had been discussed over many years and the Ross safety belt, designed in New Zealand and standard equipment there for many years, had been approved by the Surf Lifesaving Association of Australia (SLSA) in the previous two years but it's use had not been enforced. Apparently only expense prevented this type of equipment in becoming standard among the Australian surf clubs. Most of the 200 surf clubs in Australia had one Ross belt which cost 25/- each, 5/- more than the canvas type. It came to light later that Jim Peryman had the choice of the Ross safety belt or the standard belt when he went to rescue the girl. He gave the Ross safety belt

to a more inexperienced club mate to rescue a man who was in difficulties at the same time.

Shocked into action, on Monday 20 February, 1950, the SLSA decided that quick release Ross lifesaving belts must be used at all surf carnivals and in all lifesaving and drill work. It would cost the Association £1,250 to replace belts now in use with the Ross belts. The Minister for Local Government (Mr J J Cahill) said any request the NSW Govt to finance the purchase of Ross belts would be considered. That week, the Sydney branch of the SLSA distributed 100 Ross safety belts to metropolitan clubs. The following Saturday, at Coogee beach, trials began, to examine six other quick release belts, some of which incorporated amendments to the Ross belt.

The drowning of Jim Peryman was reported nationwide. The Sydney Morning Herald described the community's profound shock and called upon the clubs to re-examine their organisation and equipment, especially the use of the Ross belt which might have averted the tragedy. The article called upon the public to support the lifesavers 'who give generously of their time and expose themselves to real hazards in protecting patrons on the beaches - often from the consequences of their own folly'.

The funeral of Major James (Jim) Peryman took place on Tuesday, 21st February, 1950. All businesses in Cronulla were closed as more than 4000 people saw the funeral leave the Cronulla Church of England for the Woronora Crematorium. Officials of the SLSA and metropolitan surf clubs were among the 500 people crowded into the church. Jim's coffin was carried in the North Cronulla surf boat in a trailer towed by a lorry. They were covered with wreaths and bunches of flowers.

The procession of about 1000 cars was about four miles long and preceded by an escort of two police motor cycles. Hundreds of people lined the route from the church to the crematorium and about three hundred lifesavers most of them from the local clubs of Cronulla, North Cronulla and Wanda, marched ahead of the procession.

In September, 1951, the Royal Shipwreck Relief and Humane Society made a posthumous award to Major James Peryman for heroism. Previously, in 1948, Jim Peryman had been awarded the Meritorious Award of the Surf Lifesaving Association when he jumped into the sea, fully clothed, to rescue a young girl who had been swept off the Esplanade at the height of storms which severely damaged parts of North Cronulla.

Jim Peryman's legacy is that the SLSA, under their President, Judge Adrian Curlewis, made quick release belts mandatory and, without doubt, saved lives by their efforts to devise the best possible solution. A memorial fund was established and a swimming pool constructed at the North Cronulla Club and named in his honour.

In 2006, to celebrate the centenary of the Sutherland Shire, the Council published 'Faces of the Shire' to recognise 100 of the people 'who have embodied the spirit of the Shire over the past century'. Jim Peryman was recognised as one of those special individuals.

I never forgot my brief friendship with Jim and never made another Jaffa milkshake.

PROJECT PHOENIX REPORT

Against the backdrop of the impact of COVID 19 Restrictions and Local Government Health Orders in place to protect the health of our members and reduce the potential impact to the local community, North Cronulla Surf Life Saving club and our members moved into a new normal mode of operation.

The new normal mode of operation presented the surf club with a number of major obstacles with regards to our core objectives of Lifesaving and Patrols, Training and Education, Competition (Surf Sports), Members Welfare and Business and Administration and Community but we changed, adapted and evolved our engagement methods, process and delivery of volunteer life saving services to accommodate the COVID impact with great success and our membership should be congratulated for that effort.

Project Phoenix activities and deliverables were impacted by this new normal but we still were able to deliver on a number of important milestones and activities and progress the project towards start of construction of the new building and renovation of existing surf club facilities.

We have achieved the following milestones and deliverables during our 2020 - 2021 season:

- Expression of Interest (EOI) created and sent out to selected building contractors;
- August 2020: Reviewed EOI responses and selected building contractors were added to Tender Panel;
- Detailed Tender Package created for Design Development & Construct (DD&C) Contract;
- 12th October 2020: Tender Package issued to Tender Panel;
- 4th December 2020: Tender closing date;
- Ongoing monthly meetings held with Sutherland Shire Council regarding redevelopment project;
- December 2020 to February 2021: Tender Review Process in conjunction with Quantity Surveyor;
- January 2021: Section 4.55 (1A) Council & Surf Club requested changes to plans approved;
- February 2021: Agreement with Australian Government for Community Development Grants program for \$2,900,000 grant executed;
- March 2021: Agreement with NSW Government for the 2019/20 Surf Club Facility Program grant of \$350,000 executed;
- March 2021: Expression of Interest issued for commercial spaces in project that will move into a commercial real estate marketing campaign;
- April 2021: Special General Meeting Held.



PROJECT PHOENIX ARTIST'S IMPRESSIONS

Expenditure on Project Phoenix increased in the 2020 - 2021 to \$354,365 and includes continued engagement of our Project Manager and expenditure on all of the requirements for the Tender Package associated with a Design Development & Construct (DD&C) Contract, continued and new engagement of architects, numerous consultants and engineers and experts in various fields to provide plans and reports as per the DA Consent Conditions and Construction Certificate requirements.

We are tracking slightly behind schedule due to extra work required for the Section 4.55 (1A) changes and approval process, additional DA and CC reports and Council requirements but have the time to deliver the project well before our 100-year celebrations in 2025.

As we move into the next six months from May to December 2021, we have a few challenges and hurdles to clear but I anticipate we will deliver on the following:

- Appointment of nominated builder;
- Deed of Agreement executed with Sutherland Shire Council;

- Modified Plan of Management for North Cronulla SLSC advertised and ratified;
- Execution of contract via a modified AS4902(2000) General Conditions for Design & Construct based on Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) with nominated builder;
- Construction Certificate is issued;
- Confirmation of successful application to the 2020/21 Surf Club Facility Program and award of a grant for \$150,000;
- Bank finance arranged and our Project Phoenix commercial model completed;
- Agreement to Lease with commercial tenant or tenants in place;
- Construction to commence before end of 2021.

It is important to acknowledge the continued support and financial contributions of Sutherland Shire Council, NSW Government via NSW Office of Sport Surf Club Facilities Program (SCFP) and Australian Government via the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Cities and Regional Development Communities

Development Grants (CDG) programme. This financial support in the form of cash contributions and grants is a critical success factor to the project and on behalf of the members of North Cronulla SLSC and the community, we extend our thanks and gratitude for this continued support.

Progress has been substantial on the project over the last 12 months under extraordinary conditions and we are very close to appointing our preferred contractor and starting the construction work and then moving onto our new and updated surf club complex. Look forward to sharing that journey with you over the next 12 to 18 months and your continued interest and support in Project Phoenix is greatly appreciated.

in the works and created conditions which then also added to cancellations of events.




Due to COVID rules and restrictions, the 2020-2021 Age and Open SW State Titles were scheduled to be held at Blacksmiths Beach and Redhead Beach over four weeks between 25th of February and 21st of March 2021. Unfortunately, following three previous weeks of perfect conditions for a Surf Carnival, the final week was a disaster, heavy rain and heavy surf conditions led to the State Surfboat and March Past Championships having to be cancelled with the Surfboat Championships eventually being held some three weeks later, one week before the Aussies on the 10th and 11th of April. North Cronulla achieved some wonderful results during this time finishing 9th in the Overall Junior Point score and 10th in the Overall Open Point score and 31st in the Overall Masters Point score.

After a one-year hiatus, the 2020-2021 Aussies went ahead, again under COVID rules and restrictions, in beautiful conditions across three fantastic venues at Maroochydore, Mooloolaba and Alexandra Headlands, from 16th of April to 24th of April. Thankfully, Frank Schreuder and his team of officials ensured competition went ahead and we were off the beach as soon as possible, hoping this was not a sign of conditions to come!

NSWSLS State One and State Two. March / April 2021

The State Boat Carnival at Swansea Belmont on 19th March was cancelled due to big surf and a severe weather warning that forced the Premier to advise everyone to cancel non-essential travel. This advice was too late for the Masters and Reserve Competitors who had made their way to Swansea. 

What started out as a very low-key season turned into a highly successful not one, but TWO teams crowned Australian champions! GOLD in the U17 5-Person, and GOLD in the U15 2-Person event! Adding to that tally a Silver in the U15 5-Person and Bronze in the U19 5-Person. The 2021 campaign saw North Cronulla field a team in every event at the Australian Championships for the first time 40 years, and at NSW SLS State level every junior team came home with a medal, with a Gold and Silver in the U14 5-Person, and Silver and bronze in the U14 2-Person events.

But It was not easy, in fact it was personally one of the toughest to navigate. We lost our section head and coaching bonanza Monika Di Maio, and that combined with the ongoing Covid disaster meant there was not much interest from our competitors to put their time, effort and money on the line to commit to another season on the sand. The Most Improved Open R&R Competitor goes to Brian Cowan. Brian overcame back issues of past seasons and was the most solid of all our open competitors. JAG DIRECTOR'S REPORT

2020-2021 was an incredible year that presented hurdles and opportunities we could not have imagined. I would like to thank our JAG Executive, JAG Committee, Squad Leaders, Coaches, parents and Nippers for their unwavering support, encouragement, and commitment to the Nippers movement.



After completing the NSW SLS Age Championships for the 2019-2020 Season, we were met with two horrible weeks of weather and did not get the chance to meet before the end of the season. Little did we know we would not all be together again until our final Saturday of Season 2020-2021 at Twilight.

Season 2020/2021 was like no other for us. COVID-19 restrictions required the JAG Committee, North Cronulla Board of Management, Bate Bay Clubs, Sutherland Shire Council and Surf Lifesaving Sydney to work as a collective to facilitate Nippers. For North Cronulla, we switched our 6's and 7's Nippers to Friday afternoons and our Sundays were split between two time slots; kids, parents, Squad Leaders, and the JAG Committee worked hard to bring our kids some normality and fun in the sun.

COVID-19 did not stop our JAG Committee forging ahead and continuing to bring positive change to North Cronulla Nippers. JAG SYDNEY BRANCH DELEGATE'S REPORT

The red and yellow flags have been stored away for another year, water safety rashies and squad leader shirts washed, and dried and Nipper boards stored away as the 2020-2021 season is done. What a season too - unlike any other...

There were many barriers and restrictions with COVID-19 taking centre stage. The way clubs registered members, approached education, the Sunday nipper program and training were flipped completely.

Thank you to the Surf Lifesaving Sydney (SLSS) and particularly SLSS Director of Junior Development (JD) Doug Hawkins for supporting clubs and pushing the nipper program to progress, when the world as we knew it looked very different. Some SLSS nipper sections capped numbers, closed registrations and some elected to forgo signing up 6-year-olds. With stifling COVID-19 restrictions in place the North Cronulla JAG Committee pushed ahead deciding to hold an U6/U7 Nipper program, changing the format and moving their session to Friday afternoons.

Almost 5000 Sydney Branch Nippers successfully completed SLS Education awards during 2020-2021. Over 500 Surf Rescue Certificates (SRC) were completed, this included U14s and other members. SLS promoted the SRC course as being a base requirement in order to assist with water safety during the nipper program. These numbers are a huge feat for SLS educators across all clubs from as far south as Era through to North Bondi (the northern most club).

A huge focus of SLSS Junior Development Committee and NCSLSC is the retention of Nippers into the senior section with them ultimately completing their SRC and Bronze Medallion. SLSS JDC encourages surf

clubs to formalise a written engagement plan in this regard. To adopt direct strategies to maintain engagement as members move into the teenage years, a challenge for all clubs and one our Nipper Section will work on with the Youth Director and Club Management Team. Our Club has strong numbers moving into the senior section who are engaged in SLS, we as a section are proud of their achievements.

Each season the squad leaders select nippers in U11 and U13 to participate in the SLSS Branch Junior Development Camps. The feedback from the Nippers attending is always awesome.

Fortunately, the camps were able to go ahead with COVID-19 restrictions in place. Unfortunately, clubs were only able to select half the number of participants then prior years, considering both these age groups have some of the largest members it was a very difficult selection process. We could have sent 4 times the number. The Nippers on the camp are provided with an opportunity to meet other Nippers across Sydney and demonstrate their lifesaving skills. The Nippers realise there are many avenues in Surf Lifesaving and the feedback received is positive. Huge thanks to Doug who has been instrumental in the running of the camps. Doug has decided to step down from this position as JD Director and he will be missed.

The SLSS Branch Age Championship Carnival was planned for Maroubra over two days due to surf conditions the water events were cancelled for all

age groups. The U14s were provided the opportunity to compete in water events the following weekend with the Opens, again Maroubra turned it on - bluebottles and large surf and the events were moved to Yarra Bay.

Beach events progressed as planned and the NCSLSC competitors had great success in relays, flags, soft sand runs and sprints. The blue-ribbon events, all age board relay and all age beach relay were cancelled due to COVID-19 restrictions. NSW SLS qualifying water events (board rescue and iron person) were held at Cronulla the following weekend.

Both our club captains, Harry Payne and Rome Southwell were nominated for the SLSS Junior Lifesaver of the Year Award, both made it to the finalist stage.

During the height of COVID-19 restrictions SLSS Branch JDC elected to introduce new proficiency changes for this season only, nippers who participate in squad training could be assessed by their swim coach and declare proficient.

Nipper, community and parent engagement are always widely discussed at Sydney Development Committee meetings. JAG delegates table ideas and successful projects. However, this year meetings were via zoom and COVID-19 management became a huge focus.

At different times in the season, Sunday Nippers was on standby, clubs could not train, then groups of

This season we ensured that all age groups signed off their Junior Development Program "Passports" in the first half of the season, and by the end of the season we had processed a total of 327 surf education awards.

no more than 10 were allowed (this included coaches and water safety). Nippers attendances were recorded, parents were encouraged to 'kiss and run' and times for Nippers were upended to limit congregation. The Nipper culture thrives on volunteers and COVID-19 took our focus away from our end user, our members, the kids and we were constantly checking in at SLSS and at club level about how to look after the kids and encourage attendance.

Our social functions postponed, training sessions disappeared, the U14 trip to Queensland was moved locally and Clubs across the Branch were forced to be dynamic and think on their feet. SLSS supported us throughout the season and junior sections leaned on one another for ideas and support. We became closer to our Bate Bay Nipper sections and we exchanged information on how best to manage Nippers.

During the back end of 2020/2021 NCLSC Nippers invited some age groups from Cronulla SLSC to attend our Sunday nipper program. They were very impressed with the pool and experience at NCLSLSC. The morning was a massive success and we plan to continue to invite neighbouring clubs where possible.

Thank you for a top season! We have enjoyed being the JAG Sydney Branch Delegates for this season and would like to take this opportunity to thank other Sydney Branch Clubs and Doug Hawkins and the Sydney Branch Junior Development Committee.





NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2021

1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements cover North Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated (the club) as an individual entity. North Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated is a not-for-profit association incorporated in New South Wales under the Associations Incorporation Act 2009.

Basis of Preparation

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 2009 and the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and associated regulations. The committee has determined that the club is not a reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

The functional and presentation currency of the club is Australian dollars.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

Accounting Policies

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Trade and Other Receivables

Accounts receivable are recognised initially at the transaction price (i.e. cost) and are subsequently measured at cost less provision for impairment. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

At the end of each reporting period, the carrying amount of accounts receivable and other receivables are reviewed to determine whether there is any objective evidence that the amounts are not recoverable. If so, an impairment loss is recognised immediately in the income and expenditure statement.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2021

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a first-in first-out basis.

Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Plant and equipment is stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the items.

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated on a straight line basis to write off the net cost of each item of property, plant & equipment over the useful life as follows:

Class of Fixed Asset	Useful Life
Office Equipment	3-5 Years

The residual values, useful lives and depreciation methods are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each reporting date. An item of property, plant & equipment is derecognised upon disposal of when there is no future economic benefits to the association. Gains and losses between the carrying amount and the disposal proceeds are taken to profit or loss.

Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

Non-financial assets are reviewed for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognised for the amount by which the asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount.

Recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's fair value less costs to sell and value-in-use. The value-in-use is the present value of the estimated future cash flows relating to the asset using a pre-tax discount rate specific to the asset or cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. Assets that do not have independent cash flows are grouped together to form a cash-generating unit.

Trade and Other Payables

These amounts represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the club prior to the end of the financial year and which are unpaid. Due to their short-term nature they are measured at amortised cost and are not discounted. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefit will flow to the club and the revenue can be reliably measured. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

Donations

Donations are recognised at the time the pledge is made.

Grants

Grants are recognised at their fair value where there is a reasonable assurance that the grant will be received and all attached conditions will be complied with.

Interest

Interest revenue is recognised as interest accrues using the effective interest method. This is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a financial asset and allocating the interest income over the relevant period using the effective interest rate, which is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash receipts through the expected life of the financial asset to the net carrying amount of the financial asset.

Other revenue

Other revenue is recognised when it is received or when the right to receive payment is established.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST.

The net amount of GST recoverable or payable to the Australian Taxation Office is included in other receivables or other payables in the Statement of Financial Position. Cash flows are presented on a gross basis.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2021

Income Tax

As the club is a charitable institution in terms of subsection 50-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as amended, it is exempt from paying income tax.

Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the company's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related on-costs.

Contributions are made by the association to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

2 Critical accounting judgements, estimates and assumptions

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts in the financial statements. Management continually evaluates its judgements and estimates in relation to assets, liabilities, contingent liabilities, revenue and expenses. Management bases its judgements, estimates and assumptions on historical experience and on other various factors, including expectations of future events, management believes to be reasonable under the circumstances. The resulting accounting judgements and estimates will seldom equal the related actual results. The judgements, estimates and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next financial year are discussed below.

The club determines the estimated useful lives and related depreciation and amortisation charges for its property, plant and equipment and finite life intangible assets. The useful lives could change significantly as a result of technical innovations or some other event. The depreciation and amortisation charge will increase where the useful lives are less than previously estimated lives, or technically obsolete or non-strategic assets that have been abandoned or sold will be written off or written down.

Emphasis of Matter – Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared to assist the Club to meet the requirements of the applicable legislation. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

Responsibilities of the Committee and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Report

The Committee is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in accordance with the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Act of New South Wales* and for such internal control as the Committee determines is necessary to enable the preparation and fair presentation of a financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial report, the Committee is responsible for assessing the Clubs ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters relating to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the Committee either intends to liquidate the Club or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Club's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial report as a whole is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion.
