Sydney Branch is pleased to have scheduled two Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue (SMAR) courses for the first part of season 22-23. We hope to schedule additional courses later in the season.

**As numbers for this course are limited to a maximum of 30 candidates, places on the course will not be confirmed until after the closing date. If more people wish to register clubs will be given a quota of places. It would be appreciated if Clubs prioritise their members in order of preference and experience on beach patrol for the course.**

This award course **requires adequate physical fitness to meet the course outcomes**, which should be considered by Clubs (Club Captains) when determining which candidates, they will consider for registration in this course.

### PRE-REQUISITES

Candidates must meet ALL of the following conditions:

- be at least 16 years of age on the date of final assessment
- complete a 400 metre swim in 8 minutes or less in a swimming pool of no less than 25m length
- hold and be proficient in the SLSA Bronze Medallion

### LEARNING OUTCOMES

- Contribute to preparation activities for search and rescue operations
  - Interpret task information
  - Use basic navigational techniques
  - Select appropriate search and rescue equipment
- Perform search and rescue of a missing person
  - Identify hazards to self, bystanders and patient at an incident scene

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- Minimise risks
- Select appropriate personal protective equipment
- Communicate incident details to relevant personnel at appropriate stages
- Demonstrate an advanced water entry technique
- Describe search patterns
- Operate as a member of a search team
- Perform retrieval of a submerged object at a depth of 3-5 meters below the surface
- Participate in a night search operation
- Demonstrate recovery and stand down procedures
  - Complete operational documentation
  - Perform equipment recovery, cleaning and maintenance in line with organisational procedures
  - Describe symptoms of operational stress and sources of support

### ASSESSMENT

Assessment is through demonstration, presentation and application of all elements of competency in the workplace. Participants will be required to complete activities that may include role-plays, oral and written questioning, practical demonstrations and performing scenarios.

### RPL AND CREDIT TRANSFER

Candidates who believe they already possess some or all the skills and knowledge of this award, may wish to apply for Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL). These candidates should consult their Chief Training Officer or Branch Director Education for more information.

### PROCESS FOR CLUBS TO REGISTER EOIs

1. Clubs are to consider and select eligible members who meet the criteria and submit names of those candidates suitable for this course via jotform link provided above. Note the form allows for clubs to prioritise up to 4 names.
2. Evidence of successful timed pool swim (400m in 8mins or less). Evidence of timed swim is to be signed by Chief Training Officer or Endorsed BM Assessor and is to be emailed to Branch Office [lifesaving@surflifesavingsydney.com.au](mailto:lifesaving@surflifesavingsydney.com.au) **by Registration Close date.**  
A form is provided for clubs to use for swim time evidence [Swim Time Form SMAR Course](#)
3. After the close of registrations, the Branch will confirm with Clubs the participants who have been accepted for the course. The Club will then create the new award request in Surfguard for the SMAR Assessment and submit.
4. All confirmed course participants will be emailed a course Information Pack prior to session 1 direct from the Branch Office.
5. The Branch office will complete the Surfguard award assessment process on successful completion of the course by the member and this information will be provided to the members Club via email.

### CANDIDATE COURSE PREPARATION

The learner guide and all course resources will be provided electronically prior to the course after confirmation of acceptance and will be available in hardcopy at session 1 of the course. ### What candidates will need to bring to the course

Items that candidates **MUST** bring for the practical course exercises are listed below. Also keep in mind that the weather may get cold and wet and you will be involved in night operations training.

- Hi Viz singlet and club competition cap
- Towel/s
- Warm clothes (also consider that the course involves night operations)
- Spray jacket / wet weather jacket
- Comfortable shoes (land search)
- Sun protection (hat, sunglasses, sunscreen)
- Water bottle/snacks (e.g. muesli bars, cup-a-soups, etc)
- Wetsuit and booties
- Fins (body boarding fins)
- Mask/goggles/snorkel
- Torch
- Rescue tube
- 35<sup>th</sup> Edition *Public Safety and Aquatic Rescue* training manual
